Mission Statement

ASFPM FOUNDATION TAKES THEIR 2010 FLOOD RISK FORUM TO THE NEXT LEVEL

The ASFPM Foundation recently fulfilled one of the ten recommended action items from its March 2010 Flood Risk Forum by conducting a one-day symposium for about 70 practitioners and academics from different disciplines in both Indiana and Colorado on April 12 and 14, respectively.

These Symposia explored the state and local program and policy implications of "Managing Flood Risks and Flood Resources," including how the risk management concept and its attendant techniques could be applied to minimize flood risk to humans, the built environment, infrastructure, society, and the natural functions and resources of floodplains. The intent was to identify and develop local flood risk management indicators that complement those developed at a national level; aligned but not overlapping since perspectives will (and should) differ when one considers a national program or a local watershed.

Discussions and brainstorming revolved around developing a definition for both flood risk and floodplain management, developing local flood risk indicators, creating a model for setting and measuring goals locally, and learning how to communicate risk so that people act. "Ultimately, what it comes down to is what is happening at the state, local, and regional level," ASFPM Policy and Partnership Program Manager Sam Riley Medlock said during introductory remarks. "This is where the rubber meets the road."

This topic of Flood Risk Management is a follow-on from the ASFPM Foundation's national Flood Risk Symposia and Forum last year, where 100 national and international experts and leaders convened through a series of three events:

- Symposium 1 on September 16, 2009, addressed "Defining and Measuring Flood Risk and Floodplain Resources"
- Symposium 2 on November 4, 2009, explored "Flood Risk Perception, Communication, and Behavior"
- The 3rd Gilbert F. White Forum was held in March 2010 at George Washington University. Its goal was to facilitate discussion on the topic of flood risk to establish priorities for improving policy and program implementation and to formulate recommendations and directions for the future.

FloodManager Interactive Game Receives New Updates

"FloodManager" is a serious computer game/ simulator. It was conceived to teach decisionfloodplain makers the primary management principles they can apply to their community to increase resilience against flood disasters and to guide and steward development in their community in a manner that provides the most benefits while adhering to the tenets and practices of No Adverse Impact (NAI). Economic development via property and sales tax revenues is a community's lifeblood, for both individuals and local government, so floodplains and other critical resource areas continue to be developed, but without the long-term foresight of knowing and planning for the consequences.

"FloodManager" walks local decision-makers through various options regarding the use and development of floodplains as they grow a typical town. Then, after a selected period of time and exposure to random flood events, the consequences of those decisions can be viewed and analyzed.

The Foundation raised \$15,000 to develop Version 3.0 of "FloodManager", adding several avatar characters to explain the game and enhance the interactive experience, to be unveiled at ASFPM 2011 in Louisville. The Foundation is continuing the implementation stage by engaging stakeholders such as CTPs in hosting workshops. Of primary importance is getting this learning tool into the appropriate agencies and offices where it will be put to the most productive use. Likely this distribution will be through State Floodplain Managers and Hazard Mitigation Officers and through the ASFPM State Chapters.

Sponsorship opportunities to fund the future growth and use of "FloodManager" are still available. The
